**Becoming a Fellow of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine**, RCPI provides an opportunity to contribute to the development and maintenance of high professional standards in specialist medical practice through leadership, support and advocacy roles within the Faculty. ## Influence and Representation

The Faculty is a highly respected and influential body within the health sector. The Faculty represents the views and experience of practising clinicians to ensure that the highest possible standards of medical training and patient care are maintained.

Fellows can contribute to these initiatives by:

- Participating on Board, standing and external committees.
- Participating in healthcare policy and public advocacy programmes and groups.
- Participating in key leadership roles within the Faculty, such as Officer, Trainer, National Specialty Director and/or as Board members.
- Utilising their right to vote during Faculty elections.

## Professional Competence

The Faculty's professional competence programme reflects our commitment to lifelong learning as a professional obligation throughout a Fellow's career. Participation in the programme enables Fellows to identify gaps between actual and optimal performance, partake in educational activities and document the impact of learning on practice.

The programme promotes the enhancement of specialty-specific knowledge, skills, attitudes and performance and engagement in learning linked to a range of competencies

required to provide excellence in clinical care, education and research. All training bodies of RCPI have established professional competence schemes pursuant to the Medical Council's powers under Section 91 (2) of the Medical Practitioners Act 2007. Fellowship provides reduced rates to enrol on a PCS scheme established by these training bodies.

## Training and Education

An extensive annual education programme of events is provided, along with the increasing use of technology to deliver a wide range of online learning opportunities, including web-streamed lectures and Moodle-based courses. Much of this education is provided by Fellows, and there are extensive opportunities to become involved in the development of programmes, as well as their delivery.
