Directions from Dublin Airport by Taxi

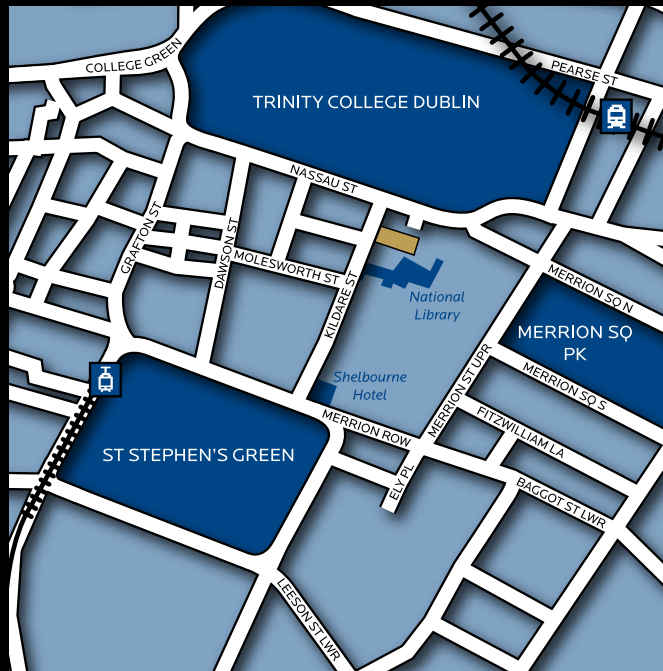
The journey time via taxi from Dublin Airport to the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland in the city centre tends to vary from 30 to 45 minutes.
