



HONORARY FELLOWSHIP



Honorary Fellowship is the highest honor that can be bestowed by the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland.

It is reserved for individuals who have made an extraordinary contribution to healthcare or medicine.

CRITERIA

- The Individual must have made an extraordinary contribution to healthcare or medicine.
- The individual does not have to be medically qualified.
- The individual must be nominated by two Fellows of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland who are in good standing. These Fellows must complete the Honorary Fellowship Proposal Form.

PROCESS FOR ADMITTING HONORARY FELLOWS

- 1 The Boards of the Faculties and Institutes consider who to propose for Honorary Fellowship
- 2 The Boards of the Faculties and Institutes propose two individuals per year for Honorary Fellowship. The President of the College may also propose an individual for Honorary Fellowship
- 3 The RCPI Credentials and Awards Committee reviews these applications and makes a recommendation to the RCPI Council
- 4 RCPI Council must approve Honorary Fellowships
- 5 Honorary Fellows are ordinarily admitted at Faculty and Institute ceremonies. One Honorary Fellow is admitted annually at a College Fellowship Ceremony
