The University Hospital Limerick (UHL) is the central hub for the five associated hospitals in the Mid West region. Ennis Hospital, University Maternity Hospital Limerick, Nenagh Hospital, Croom Hospital and St John's Hospital are integral parts of the network that treat patients in accordance to their model status. While they do not have an ED, each has a Medical Assessment Unit, a Local Injuries Unit, a very active day Surgery Unit and medical in-patient beds for selected medical patients

Mid West Acute Hospitals serve a population of 413,059 (census 2022) people in Limerick, Clare and North Tipperary. UHL is the largest hospital in the region where we care for our sickest patients. It is the only hospital in the Mid West that has a full 24/7/365 emergency and critical care service for those who require more complex medical and surgical care.

There are 535 inpatient beds at UHL, 51 of these are paediatric beds.

UHL has a dedicated cardiac centre offering 24/7 for STEMI service. It is one of the five specialist cancer centres in the country.

We provide acute and specialist healthcare services on an inpatient and outpatient basis across our hospitals. Our staff are our most important asset developing and supporting them is a key priority for us. We are extremely proud of and celebrate our diverse workforce.

Together with our academic partner, the University of Limerick (UL) we work to improve standards of care and foster Education, Clinical Research and Innovation.

Our first class training and on-campus (UHL) research facilities include the Clinical Education and Research Centre (CERC) and the Health Sciences Academy.

BASIC SPECIALIST TRAINING IN GENERAL INTERNAL MEDICINE IN THE MID WEST HUB

At ULHG we are committed to train doctors to become world-class specialists and to help you to reach your full potential.

General Internal Medicine deals with the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of adult diseases. Doctors specialising in General Internal Medicine need expert knowledge of a wide range of common acute disorders due to the type of patients they encounter, and often have to manage seriously ill patients with undifferentiated or multi-system disease processes.

The vast majority of physicians have a subspecialty interest in diseases affecting particular organs or organ systems. The subspecialties in General Internal Medicine are:

We also ensure that our trainees who are undertaking their Membership are as prepared as possible. We offer consultant delivered tutorials for the MCQ preparation in the lead up to the clinical exams, we have specific membership orientated tutorials on a weekly basis in a syllabus format and bedside teaching is offered on a regular basis in preparation for your MRCPI part 2 clinical.

We organise mock interviews for our SHOs who are applying for Registrar and SpR programs and further support is available in preparation for progression to SpR training. We encourage all our trainees to partake in research and audit with opportunities to submit abstracts and present at NCHD Conference.

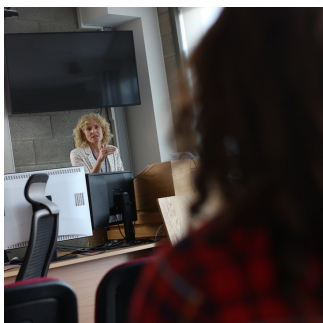

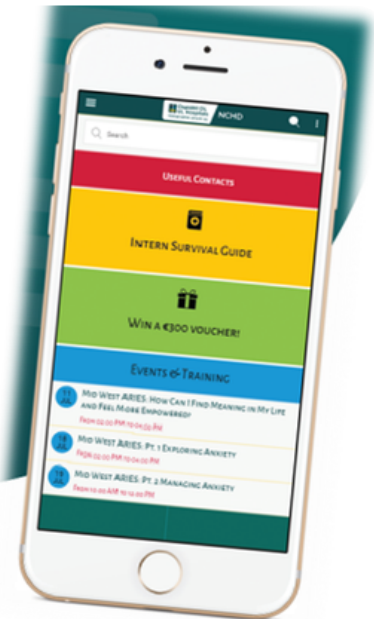

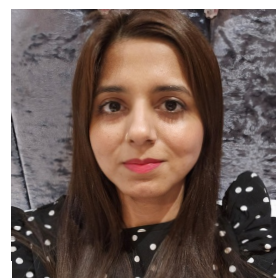


The primary roles of the NDTP Training Lead office are:

The Lead NCHD role should facilitate enhanced communication between NCHDs and management in a way that provides NCHDs, through the Lead NCHD, with an opportunity to participate in service discussions and decision making regarding; matters that affect NCHDs, the day-to-day running of hospitals/ mental health services, and solutions/improvements to enhance patient care.

Each Lead NCHD will have access to an educational fund to undertake an academic qualification in Management and/or Leadership Skills in the Republic of Ireland.

SIMULATION AT CERC, UHL

University of Limerick and UL Hospitals Group officially launched a new simulation facility at University Hospital Limerick in 2023; providing undergraduate and postgraduate Doctors, Nurses and Allied Health professionals with simulation training in a range of clinical procedures.

The Simulation Lab has a wide variety of equipment in its simulation-based education and training programmes, including full-body manikins and task trainers (adult, paediatric and maternity).

In addition to regular teaching, several other events have been hosted in the Simulation Lab, including advanced cardiac life support (ACLS), clinical induction training for Interns, Interprofessional education teaching with health sciences students, MRCPI examinations, organ donation education, basic ECHO training, and Adult Critical Care Transport training.

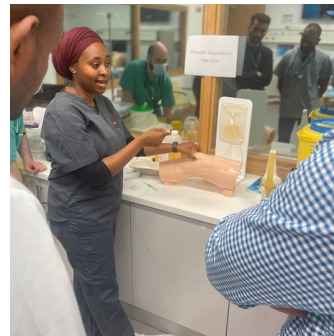

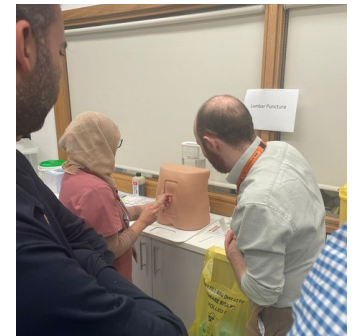

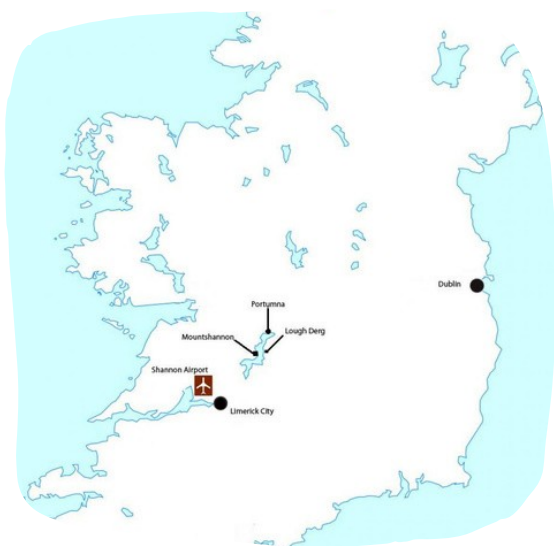

There are also ample opportunities to further your career. With support and teaching in preparation for the membership of the royal college of physician examinations, you can feel confident in preparing for further examinations.

UHL also hosts many different courses throughout the year allowing the opportunity to learn hands on and useful skills such as point of care ultrasound training and bedside Echo training.

Overall, UHL will provide the environment for a well rounded post graduate training and ensure the opportunity to further education.

"I must say when I initially was offered the Midwest hub, I was hesitant to accept due to the negative uproar from the media and other sources.

However, I am glad I did, I am a better physician than I was last year with loads of learning opportunities from different specialties especially Neurology and Nephrology.
